In my last role as an Investigator assigned to the Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force, the skill I learned in this course directly led to the successful prosecution of numerous predators targeting children. Having the understanding how Networking works as well as learning the different protocols computers use to access the internet became an invaluable set of knowledge.

One example of the direct impact this program had was a recent investigation that began with an image of CSAM being shared via an online portal. Following the digital footprints left behind by the suspect a search warrant was obtained for the suspect's residence, thousands of images and other pieces of evidence were located. Evidence was also located in which the suspect recorded himself committing heinous acts against a child. This ended with the suspect entering a guilty plea and being sentenced to life in federal prison. I truly believe this offender would still be targeting future victims if it had not been for this program.
